EXCLUSIVE COMMERCIAL FRANCHISE AGREEMENT	<p>The City of San José has an exclusive Commercial Solid Waste and Recyclables Collection Agreement with Republic Services Inc. for the collection of waste from businesses within the City, including recyclables and organics. This award-winning system keeps all San Jose businesses compliant with regulations such as Mandatory Recycling (AB 341) and Mandatory Organics Recycling (AB 1826). NON-EXCLUSIVE COMMERCIAL FRANCHISE AGREEMENT	<p>The City also has non-exclusive collection agreements with multiple companies for the collection of certain types of construction and demolition debris as well as residential property clean-out debris. Residents and businesses interested in a debris bin can view the Construction, Demolition and Residential Clean-out Haulers webpage (www.sjenvironment.org/recyclers-haulers) and choose a company from the list of non-exclusive haulers (www.sjenvironment.org/authorizedhaulers). CLEAN-UP EVENT	<p>The Neighborhood Clean-Up program was discontinued December 31, 2017. Residents can use the free Junk Pickup (Large Items) program.</p>
JUNK PICKUP (LARGE ITEMS)	<p>Single-family: If you have garbage cart service, large items such as tires, furniture, appliances, and televisions generated from the home can be collected curbside by appointment for free. Multi-family: If you have garbage dumpster service, large items such as tires, furniture, appliances, and televisions generated from the home can be collected from your complex by appointment for free. Note: some property managers may require that renters contact the property management company first.</p>

EXTRA GARBAGE STICKERS	<p>Single-family residents may place extra garbage in a 32-gallon plastic garbage bag labeled with an extra garbage sticker. Extra garbage stickers may be purchased for \$6.25 at all San José libraries, Lucky, and Safeway stores or at the Customer Service Center on the first floor of San José City Hall. NOTE: libraries are unable to sell stickers during the Covid-19 pandemic. Maximum weight limit of 60 lbs. per bag.</p>		
HOLIDAY TREE REMOVAL	<p>Single-family: Recycle your holiday tree on your collection day from December 26th throughout the month of January each year.</p> <p>Multi-family: Service is available to all MFDs; contact GreenWaste at (408) 283-4800 for information and set out details. Property manager approval via a signed Service Agreement is required.</p>

Food-soiled paper ²		X	Napkins, paper towels, paper plates, paper cups, greasy pizza boxes, coffee filters, tea bags, and other soiled paper items should be placed in the garbage cart.
Yard Trimmings	X		Branches, leaves, flowers, grass clippings, sod, and palm fronds only; no rocks, soil, concrete, paper/compostable foodware, fruit/vegetables, pumpkins, food scraps, lumber, or pet waste. Loose or cart service is determined by the City. Loose piles should be 12” from the curb and no larger than five feet in any direction. Branches should be no longer than five feet and/or six inches in diameter. Subscription cart service available.
